We Walk As One People

Our collective hearts are broken, as we watch the news, and all that is happening to our beloved state of Israel. I spoke to one of our Bar Mitzvah students who was supposed to have his Bar Mitzvah in Israel this month. I asked him how he was coping and was he terribly disappointed? He told me that his family was informed that the war could go on for years.

We are scheduled to take a trip to Israel this February as a congregation. I question now whether that will happen. I pray that it will.

What can we do? First let me address what we cannot do. We cannot stand idly by the blood of our brothers. I believe that all blood that is shed is our brother's blood. We can gather in solidarity for peace, we can collect items needed, and send them to the Middle East, we can send money to organizations who will help. We are our brother's keeper. With-in this bulletin you will find ways to help.

However, we are so far away. I have been reciting T'hillim, psalms, since the savage attacks in Israel that has led to her once again being at war. T'hillim are our way of coping. The psalms allow us to accept that there is evil in the world, and that there has always been evil in the world. Our responsibility is to create a world that is healed through Tikkun Ha'Olam acts of repairing the world. The psalm that I find myself most reciting is Ps. 121. Esa Einai, I will lift up my eyes to Adonai. God is my shield and my protector.

Unfortunately, this will not be one week, or two weeks, or a month of holding Israel in our hearts. This will be many months, if not years. Let us not loose our strength, do not let our resolve and commitment to Israel slip. As in Psalm 121, we are taught that God will not let your foot slip. We must keep the three words that we have chanted and sung for years, Am Yisrael Chai in our hearts and minds.

I want to encourage you to look at psalms and recite a psalm every day. If you are interested in joining me in this practice, please reach out to me at cantor@jcoh.org, and I will send you a zoom link each day so we can recite a psalm together. I would also encourage you to take a deeper dive into the Psalms, with the class that the rabbi is teaching.



Rabbi's Sabbatical: A Time for Renewal, Reflection, and Writing



Gardeners and farmers know that giving land a year off is of great benefit to the soil. Letting the land rest allows it to replenish itself; it reduces pests; and it improves water retention, thereby improving future growth. This method of renewal has been practiced since ancient times. In the Torah, Leviticus 25:2-4, God tells Moses, 'When you enter the land that I assign to you, the land shall observe a sabbath of the Eternal. Six years you may sow your field... But in the seventh year the land shall have a sabbath of complete rest, a sabbath of the Eternal: you shall not sow your field or prune your vineyard.'

The concept of a sabbatical year for clergy and professors is rooted in these verses from the Torah. It is a customary practice for synagogues to grant sabbatical time to rabbis, providing them with an opportunity to replenish themselves. This dedicated period allows them to engage in study, personal growth, and to take the much-needed time for themselves and their families.

Believe it or not, this is my seventh year at the Jewish Center of the Hamptons. To this end, I will be embarking on my first Sabbatical beginning January through the month of March. During this period of reflection, I have a deeply personal and spiritual project that I am undertaking. I am excited to share with you all that I will be dedicating this sabbatical time to writing and publishing my first book. This endeavor has been a dream of mine for quite some time, and I believe it will not only be a meaningful expression of my faith but also a valuable resource for our congregation and beyond.

I want to assure you that our synagogue will continue to thrive during my absence. In my time away, Cantor Debra Stein, Rabbi, will be joined by Rabbi Alexis Pinsky, who will cover my Shabbat responsibilities. Shabbat services, lifecycle events, educational programs, and community gatherings will continue as scheduled.

I am deeply grateful for your understanding and support as I embark on this sabbatical journey. I look forward to returning to our congregation in April with renewed energy, fresh insights, and, God willing, a completed manuscript.

Excerpt from Rabbi Franklin's remarks at the Rally in Solidarity with Israel



"No, I'm not ok!" That's how I want to respond when people ask me how I'm doing.

I'm angry, I'm sad, I'm disgusted, I'm in pain, my heart hurts, my soul feels crushed. It might feel easier to say I'm fine, but let's be honest, we are not fine. None of us are really ok, and that's why we're here.

A weird thing happened to me on Saturday night; I accidentally scratched the cornea of my right eye.

As a result, my eye wouldn't stop tearing. Yet my eyes were already swollen with tears; my cheeks damp from crying all day; for a bit, I couldn't tell my crying was because of the pain in my eye or the excruciating agony in my heart.

These have been some of the hardest days I'v had in my ten years of being a rabbi. I've never felt so close to teetering from internal anger to externalized rage. I want to remain calm and collected, but, quite honestly, I'm having trouble doing so.

But I will say this: I do not bear hatred against any people. I ask that you join me in not permitting yourselves to let hatred seep into your souls. It will poison you, and we are bigger than that. Do not hate the Egyptians, Moses told the Israelites, even though they enslaved you; killed your children; were your tyrants. It's not our way.

I do not hate, but I DO unequivocally condemn the brutal and sinister actions of the terrorists who murdered more Jews in a single day than any day since the Holocaust. These were primarily unarmed Israeli's, women, children, and babies. They weren't collateral damage, they were targeted because they were defenseless. They were brutalized by terrorists in ways nothing short of an expression of pure evil, and the perpetrators, proud of their work, posted videos of it and mocked their victims. No moral equivalency should ever be made to justify or rationalize this behavior.

And yet, despite my anger, despite my pain, despite the massive losses—of friends, family, and our people, I choose not to hate.

I choose instead to embrace my loved ones and my community, to cry with you, and support you, and hopefully, we can find strength in our shared stories, our shared history, and our shared future.
