





It took author and photographer Brad Kolodny four years to document synagogues from Great Neck to Montauk and in doing so he traces the history of Long Island's Jewish religious life from 1896 to today.

385 buildings were photographed that currently are, or at one time were used as a Jewish house of worship. This expansive compilation of images depicts the functional and aesthetic variation in American synagogue design and tracks the trajectory of popular styles throughout the 20th century.

TO PAINT THE EARTH SUNDAY, JULY 16 4:00pm

Please join us as we commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising with a live production of "To Paint the Earth." On the early morning of April 19th, 1943, a small band of untrained fighters, using homemade bombs and a few smuggled-in weapons, forced Nazi tanks to turn and retreat. Netta Barak-Corren Sunday, July 23 | 10:30am Changes in the Israeli Judicial System and the Separation of Powers in Israel

Netta Barak-Corren is a legal scholar and cognitive scientist, focusing on empirical and behavioral analysis of constitutional and public law, with a particular interest in the interaction between law and religion. She is a Professor of Law at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and a member of the Federmann Center for the Study of Rationality. Barak-Corren received her first degree in Law and in Cognitive Science from the Hebrew University (Valedictorian and three-time recipient of the Albert Einstein and Rector awards). She then clerked for the Chief Justice of the Israeli Supreme Court, Hon. Dorit Beinish, and pursued doctoral studies at Harvard Law School, graduating in 2016.



TURNING ASH TO BRICK

A resident of war-torn Gaza, Majd Mashharawi observed the acute need for access to construction material in order to rebuild damaged buildings and infrastructure. She strove to meet this need by founding GreenCake in 2015, a company that creates environmentally friendly bricks from ash and rubble.

In the summer of 2017 she developed SunBox, an affordable solar device that produces energy to alleviate the effects of the energy crisis in Gaza, where access to electricity has been severely restricted, sometimes to less than three hours a day. With SunBox, she was able to provide electricity to hundreds of people; SunBox was awarded a prize in the annual MIT Pan Arab competition. She received her BSc in Civil Engineering from the Islamic University of Gaza. In 2018 she was selected as one of the most creative people in business by Fast Company.

Judaism Beyond Slogans

American Jews use a lot of buzz words to describe their social justice commitments - tikkun olam, God's image, loving the stranger. What do those terms really mean? Do they really imply that there is only one point of view on those issues? A controversial talk, with a healthy dose of nuance.

Rabbi Jeffrey Salkin is the rabbi of Temple Israel in West Palm Beach, Florida, and the author of numerous books on Jewish spirituality and ethics, published by Jewish Lights Publishing and Jewish Publication Society. He was one of the first rabbis to earn the Doctor of Ministry degree from Princeton Theological Seminary. His colleagues have called him "an activist for Jewish ideas," "courageous," "always relevant," and "a rabbi's rabbi." Rabbi Salkin's award-winning blog, "Martini Judaism: for those who want to be shaken and stirred," is published by the Religion News Service.



AMERICAN POLITICS IN ISRAEL

Amanda Berman (she/her) is the Founder and Executive Director of the Zioness Movement, where she works to empower and activate Zionists on the progressive left to stand proudly in social justice spaces as Jews and Zionists. She is also a civil rights attorney who previously worked to fight antisemitism legally, spearheading such groundbreaking initiatives as the international action against Kuwait Airways for its discrimination against Israeli nationals, and the dual cases against San Francisco State University for its constitutional and civil rights violations against Jewish and Israeli students and community members. Amanda graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with a BA in Diplomatic History and a Master of Governmental Administration and received her Juris Doctor from the Benjamin N.
